
2018-2019 school year at this time and parents must fill out a form in our office if they are requesting a Dual Language opportunity for their child.

How are we developing our brains in 2nd grade? I


n math, we have been working on counting in various ways. Counting forward and backwards by ones, 2s, 5s and 10s,100s and 1000s orally, but also with sets of objects. This is such an important part of math as students are practicing fluency with numbers and seeing patterns. This skill is also the foundation for multiplication.

In literacy, we are so lucky to have been a part of a drama project from Rosey Waters Imagination Makers Drama Company. In this project, students were able to weave in a story and comprehension strategies through drama. This deepens student learning as students are actually "feeling" their learning. We will continue to weave in drama throughout other subject areas this school year.

Hello families.

Thank you very much for your support in our Big City field trip! We thoroughly enjoyed our walking tour of Denver, seeing the past, present, and future of an urban area firsthand. Please look for permission slips for our next field trip to the Denver Museum of Nature and Science on December 20th. We will become gem miners!

In Writing, we are studying Narrative Stories. After reading many mentor texts we will use our imagination to write a short story about the life of our main character. Our next unit is Writing about Research, where we will be using our prior knowledge of "how to" writing to craft explanatory paragraphs about processes or topics of interest. Reading brings us to Fiction texts and a study of how characters develop over the course of a story. We will be focusing on fables, myths, and folktales from diverse cultures. Later in the unit, we will return to Nonfiction. This learning requires us to use Nonfiction text features to dig into what the author is trying to teach us through their writing.

Math is all about Measurement, Time, and Graphs! We are using all of the hard work we have done with multiplication and division to help us understand the aforementioned concepts. Please continue to memorize facts at home (multiplication and addition). In Science, we are studying the Recipe of Earth's materials. We will explore different types of rock cycles and what ends up with these rocks in the real world.

4th Grade News!

What a great November we've had! We had two exciting field trips to the Jefferson County Fairgrounds and to the movies to watch "WONDER"! It was very exciting to compare the movie to the book!

As we move into a much deserved Thanksgiving break, we would like to let you know what your wonderful 4th graders are up to at school and what to expect when they come back on November 27th.

In **reading** we are working on identifying the main idea and details. We will be testing students with the DRA (English) & EDL (Spanish) on their progress in reading so far this year on Flex Day (December 15th).

In **writing** we are finishing up our unit on informational writing. We have been focusing on using mentor texts to help guide our writing, with a focus on grammar, conventions and the structure of multi-paragraph essays. We will be moving into a new unit on informational research writing.

In math we are working on division with whole numbers. Please make sure your child is practicing their multiplication facts every night! It is a whole lot easier to divide when you know your multiplication facts!

The fourth graders have also been working hard participating in 4th Grade Life! Each student gets paid weekly \$325 (minimum wage of \$9.30/hr x 7 hours/5 days a week). They also have bills to pay like rent, utilities, WiFi, as well as possible fees for not having their iPad, missing work and making poor choices. This is a great way to get the students to be thinking about math on a daily basis throughout the day as well as teaches the 4th graders to make better choices and see the consequences of their choices (opportunity cost)!

In science we are working on a unit around energy.




In science, they will study volcanos and plate tectonics.


For their literacy units during this month, the students will be conducting research projects. They are learning to paraphrase the information of others and organize information they gather from many sources into their own original work.

Please assist your students in returning library books on time. If lost or damaged, library staff can assist families in working out a payment plan so that students can continue to borrow books from the library. Overdue notices are sent out periodically to help families monitor books checked out.

Hour of Code is a world-wide effort to expose students to computer science. Foster will be participating the week of December 4-10.
