

## Welcome Kinder Families!

Spring is here! Students have been working very hard all winter and are ready for a well-deserved break.

They have been busy researching and writing about their topic of choice and will return to writing stories about themselves in the last writing unit.

Students are also beginning to monitor their reading in multiple ways! Practice sight words at home to support your child in reading.

Our focus in math this month has been to understand addition and subtraction stories in real world contexts. In the final math unit, kindergartners will solidify their understanding of part and whole relationships as well as compare measurable attributes, such as length and weight.

You can support your child in science by discussing how the sun impacts the earth and affects our daily activities. Observe the sky at different times throughout the day.

It has been such a joy to see the growth that each child has made this year.

Thank you to everyone that could make it to our Second Grade Weather Showcase! It was wonderful to see the kids present everything they have been learning around Weather! Here is what we have been up to lately!

**Reading:** Students have been researching their weather topics and recording facts and information. Students have been learning the features of nonfiction, questioning and finding answers in books. We will start reading different fairy tales next month. Please continue to have your child read with you each night.

**Writing:** Students have been writing non-fiction and researching their weather topic. Students went through the entire writing process of planning, drafting, revising, editing and finally published their own book. After the break we will start writing fictional stories.


**Math:** We have learned about 2D and 3D shapes, data, graphing, and time! Students will work on 2 and 3 digit addition and subtraction after spring break. You can help by practicing basic math facts at home with your child.

**Science and Social Studies:** We completed our Habitats unit and our Weather units! These were so much fun! We will learn about Push and Pull forces later this year. In Social Studies we will soon be starting a unit on Economics and after that we will do a unit on communities!

**Social and Emotional Learning:** Each week we take time to talk about our Peace Promises and the importance of being a community member. Students take calming breaks as a whole class or on their own as needed. Students also take Physical Activity breaks throughout the day.

Dear families,


We are in the midst of our state assessments (CMAS). Third graders took English Language Arts on March 20, 21, and 22 and will take Math on April 10, 11, and 12 from 9:15-11:15. Please ensure that your student is getting lots of rest during this time, and please encourage them to do their best! We want students to understand the value of trying their best, staying calm, and focusing on the task-at-hand.

Outside of testing, third grade will be working on our PBL unit concentrated on states of matter and alternative energy solutions in our Foster community. We also get the chance to engineer a carnival game for the Foster Carnival that will take place on Thursday, April 12 from 5:30-7:00!

After testing, in math, we will focus on multi-digit addition and subtraction applied to word problems. Reading and Writing bring us to our "Pulling it Together" units in which we will review previous learning and cement strategies that will prepare students for fourth grade and beyond.

In the past month, we have been busy preparing for the review units. We have had so much growth and now we look forward to much more before we end the year.




Hello 6th grade families!

## iPad reminders

Please encourage and remind your child to bring their school iPad every day ready for classroom use by being fully

charged. Reminding students to never drink or eat while using their school device will assist students in following school expecta-

tions. If you are experiencing issues with connecting to your home internet, please notify your child's teacher; he/she has access to help documents which may get students connected. Chargers sometimes fail; when they do we can help determine which part needs replacement (box or cable). The cost of replacement of a cable is \$11.50; the cost of the box is also \$11.50. We do ask families to cover the replacement cost of chargers.

## Lost and Overdue Library Books

As we get closer to the end of the year, we continue to make efforts to locate books that are overdue or lost. If your child is receiving notices for overdue books, please assist them in locating lost books. Lost books can also be paid for in the LMC. Thank you for assisting us in making all titles available to our students by returning books when due or paying for replacements.





JSEL (Jeffco Summer of Early Learning) is a six-week, intensive summer school program that focuses on increasing students' literacy and math skills.

JSEL will be in session from June 6-July 18, 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. each day, except July 4.

Sessions will be held at seven elementary schools this year:

Emory Glennon Heights Lawrence Lumberg Parr Stevens Swanson.

Parents from any Jeffco school may choose from any of the seven locations. Dual language programs for students who are currently enrolled in dual language programs will be held at Emory and Lumberg.

Each day, kindergarten through third-grade students (grades for the 2018-19 school year) will have the same emphasis on reading and writing as they do during the school year. Students will also deepen their number sense and develop problem-solving abilities through a variety of math activities. Small class sizes will allow all students to learn in an authentic, experienced-based, and engaging manner.

Students who are not currently at end-of-year benchmarks or are on a READ plan, who have been recommended by his/her teacher are eligible for JSEL. JSEL is for students who are entering grades kindergarten through third grade in the fall of 2018.

JSEL is free to all eligible students and, also offers free breakfast and lunch through the Federal Summer Lunch Program. <u>Click here</u> to view the brochure which provides additional information about the program.




Fit Bits: News from the Foster P.E. Deartment!

# **Music Notes**

Grade levels will be using our Jeffco Music Curriculum to guide learning. It is my goal to provide varied musical opportunities for all students including singing, moving, playing and technology.

Here is a list of things that each grade level will be working on:

6<sup>th-</sup> 12 Accidentals and scales, harmony, form, cut time, improvisation, sixteenth-dotted eighth, suite

5<sup>th</sup>- 3 and 4 part canons, bass clef, syncopation, accidentals, diatonic scales, improvisation, recorders, slur

4<sup>th</sup>- Melodic and rhythmic ostinato, interlude, accelerando and ritardando, solfege,dotted quarter and eighth notes, dynamics and performance skills

3<sup>rd</sup>- Rondo form, ostinato, music alphabet, solfege, dotted half note, largo and allegro and performance skills

2<sup>nd</sup>- Solfege, ABA form, rhythm, 1 chord accompaniments, 4 and 8 beat patterns, skips and steps and performance skills

1<sup>st</sup>-beat, notation, vocal qualities, musical opposites, rhythmic and melodic patterns, cues, Introduction, phrase and performance skills


