
## Principal's Page

We have several things coming up this month that you might want to know about:

#### **ACCESS testing**

Testing will wrap up early this month. This is the assessment we are required to give to students who speak a language other than English in their home who have not reached a specified level of English proficiency. We did our best to not impact ongoing learning as we tested almost 50% of our population.

#### Choice Enrollment window for PK 3 and 4 year olds:

PK enrollment opened on January 17th for all PK students. It closes February 14th, so make sure that you apply this round. We are likely to not have openings for students after round 1.

4 year olds: Parents need to use this link: 4 year old Universal PK, which will take them to the state site. While filling out the application, be sure to choose Foster Dual Language PK as your choice for next school year.

3 year olds: Parents must use this link: Enroll Jeffco

#### Preschool February Newsletter

Dear preschool families,

We are super excited to meet with you to talk about the growth your student has shown during our parent/teacher conferences on February 7 and 9th. It is a pleasure to be part of your students' learning experience.

We will be concluding our Study Unit #4 "What's the matter in your motion?" on February 10th and will be starting our Study Unit #5 " *Is What I Want, What I Need?*" on February 13th. The focus of this lesson will be about how money is earned, and that choices can be made on how to spend and save money, based on wants and needs. Day to day, the classroom will be alive with learning that will build our students' foundation for financial literacy and economics.

During purposeful play centers, children will participate in classroom jobs, exchange pretend money in realistic scenarios, dramatize work associated with the job(s) that are performed at places within a community, and sort coins and currency. We will discuss why we need money: to buy, save, and give and have a field trip to the Arvada Center on Thursday, February 23rd.

As we've been planning to bring learning to life in exciting ways at school, we invite you to do the same at home! You are your child's first teacher -we encourage you to make connections as your family engages in the behaviors and choices that surround work, earning and spending money, saving, and giving! Ideas to share in these experiences include:

- Co-create grocery list
- Co-create responsibility chart
- Create an earnings system, reinforcing the concept of working to earn money
- Penny/savings jar
- Donating time/community outreach
- Use vocabulary as you're immersed in these experiences including: want, need, choice, money, coins, bills, small, big, brown, silver



#### **Key Vocabulary:**

want, need, choice, money, coins, bills, physical attributes of coins (small, big, brown, silver, etc.), bazaar

#### Literacy

Students will be learning our Estrellita segment #4, letters n, f,b,j in Spanish. We encourage you to practice the sound chart with your students and find words, pictures, and items that start with the letter sounds. Some games you can play at home to reinforce phonological awareness are *I Spy-initial sound (exp. something that starts with mmmm)*, rhyming games, or clapping each syllable of a word. Reading at home and talking about the stories are a great way to build vocabulary and comprehension skills.



#### Math

Students will continue to solve simple addition and subtraction number stories. They will have the opportunity to create number stories, act them out, and use objects to solve number problems. We will introduce the names and values of coins and continue to work on shapes, counting, and number recognition.

#### Dear First Grade Families


It's amazing to think that in the blink of an eye January is over.

Thank you so much for all you do for us including heading to the Zoo with us and volunteering for our upcoming field trips. We are also excited to meet with you for Parent Teacher Conferences and to celebrate all your students' hard work.

Starting February 6th, we will start Module 6, Celebrate America, with reading in English and writing will be in Spanish.

In Mathematics we will start our unit 5 about Place Value Situations where students develop flexibility with using the structure of tens and ones to compute and to solve word problems, focusing on extending understanding of addition strategies to those used for subtraction.

In Social Studies we will be talking about different leaders and what makes a good leader.



#### Second Grade News



#### Literacy:

We have completed our literacy unit about leadership and we will move on to Module 6 which focuses on seasons and extreme weather events. This literacy unit aligns well with science. Students will be reading and writing about our natural world. Ms. Laura will be teaching Reading and Science and Ms. Elena has Writing and Math. We are so excited to see our students grow as readers and writers and can see a lot of wonderful growth!

#### Math:

In math we are working hard to help students master subtraction with regrouping with 2 digit numbers!! We are focusing on word problems and helping students learn how to think through problems, determine if they should add or subtract and then solve. We will also learn how to tell time to the nearest 5 minutes and the difference between A.M. and P.M. This is always a little tricky so please quiz your students by asking throughout the day what time it is and if it is AM or PM? They will love to show you their skills!




#### Science:



We will continue to explore earth's systems and processes that shape our earth this month. Questions for students to ponder have been: How does the earth change over time? How does the earth change quickly? How are landforms made? What causes earthquakes? We have been having so much fun experimenting and learning!

Hello Third Grade Dual families,

We are looking forward to meeting with you all again during Parent-Teacher conferences to discuss your child's progress. This month is packed with lots of fun things like the Book Fair, Family Dance and our first field trip. Please let us know if you would like to help us plan another field trip for students. Be sure to check Class Dojo for important updates and announcements, and if you ever have any questions or con-

cerns do not hesitate to let us know!

#### Here is what we are learning in class with Ms. Paola:

**Writing**: Over the next three weeks in module 6, our class will develop knowledge about the behavior of animals, with a focus in the genre of nonfiction text. We will read texts about behaviors and characteristics that help animals to survive. The children will also write a scientific paper for a imaginary magazine.

**Math:** In unit 6, students are introduced to the concepts of perimeter and area of rectangles and rectilinear figures. Students find unknown side lengths using inverse operations and partition rectangles and rectilinear figures to determine area. They explore the relationships between area and perimeter by investigating rectangles with the same perimeter and different areas, as well as rectangles with the same area and different perimeter. Students connect area and perimeter to the attributes of shapes (specifically quadrilaterals) as they categorize and classify shapes. Finally, students utilize visual representations to describe, analyze, and compare properties of shapes.

**SLD**: In order to support our HMH unit for module 6 students will focus on their Spanish fluency and phonemic awareness. They will also review and practice the vocabulary from <u>Arriba la lectura</u>. The students are also focusing on the right pronunciation of Spanish words and phrases.

#### Here is what we are learning in class with Ms. Mari:

#### Reading:

At the end of module 6, Animal Behaviors, students will understand what behaviors help animals survive. Students will listen to, read, and view a variety of texts and media that present them with information about animal survival. A genre focus on nonfiction will provide students with opportunities to identify the author's purpose, central idea, and text structure in order to better understand unfamiliar texts. As students build their vocabulary and synthesize topic knowledge, they will learn more about the way animals utilize behaviors and characteristics, or traits, to help them survive.

#### Science:

In science, we will begin Unit 3, Inheritance and Variation of Traits. Some of the essential questions for this unit are: How do organisms grow and develop? How are the characteristics of one generation related to the previous generation? Why do individuals of the same species vary in how they look, function, and behave. How does genetic variation among organisms affect survival and reproduction?

By the end of this unit, students will understand that reproduction is essential to the continued existence of every kind of organism. They will also understand that many characteristics involve both inheritance and environment and sometimes the differences in characteristics between individuals of the same species provide advantages in surviving, finding mates, and reproducing.

#### ELD:


In English Language Development (ELD), we are building our listening, speaking and comprehension skills in English. We are using this time to reteach and deepen their knowledge of the module's vocabulary, generative vocabulary (prefixes and suffixes), grammar, and foundational skills.

#### 4<sup>th</sup> grade Newsletter!

In **Reading**, We read all about different types of art in English. Some of the things included sculptures, dancing, music, photographs, etc. Students had a blast listening to Beatles music and dancing music from different cultures. Our next unit will be about what makes Earth's natural wonders exciting and unique in Spanish.

In **Writing**, students just finished up their Module 5 unit about why people are extraordinary with expository Essays in Spanish. Our next unit will be writing letters to experts about Earth's natural wonders in English.

#### 6th grade:

We have been working on ecosystems with their relationships and this month we will start everything related to how living beings feed in the ecosystem, we will learn the concepts of Carnivores, Herbivores and omnivores and we will work recognizing how each of these interact with each other in the chain and food web.

#### 7h grade

We are learning about the systems of the human body and the care that we must have to maintain adequate health and avoid diseases. This month we are learning the human excretory and respiratory system, where we will do laboratory practices to recognize tissues and functions of these systems and their organs.

#### 8th grade:

We will be learning about the properties of sound. We will carry out several experiments that show us how the propagation of this light is to be able to identify it in our daily life.

**6th and 7th Grade:** We are working on balancing budgets based on different fictional avatars. They are learning personal finance based on the board game, the Game of Life.

8th Grade: In the current unit, we are looking at the Civil War. Students are analyzing the root causes of the war as well as the implications to today's world.

Hello y hola familias,

I look forward to meeting your students and your family. In my class we are currently working on...

**6th grade:** We are currently working on creating double number lines with percentages. We are using dollars and cents as examples. Students are a couple of lessons away from starting unit 4. The goal is to start unit 4 in February where we will be reviewing division and fractions.

**7th grade:** We are currently working on proportional relationships by solving real world and mathematical problems. In this fourth unit, we will calculate problems using a table chart of 2 rows and 2 columns to find the unknown value. A few key terms we will be reviewing are, constant proportionality, percent increase, percent decrease, percentage and percent error. We will also be reviewing long division in the next few weeks.

8th grade: We are currently working on solving puzzle problems using equations and diagrams in unit 4. In these puzzle problems they are using "x" to identify the unknown variable. In the next few weeks we will also dive into linear equations. We are identifying terms and expressions. For example, 5x is a term in the expression 5x-8.

We will use the resources "building fact fluency" and "IXL". Both provide individualized and group opportunities that will allow students to improve in what they need.

**6th Grade:** In the third quarter of this school year, the sixth graders will be working on writing their own literary nonfiction essays. They will go through the process of choosing a topic, creating guiding questions, conducting research to gather information, drafting their essay, revising and editing, and completing a final draft.

7th Grade: In the third quarter of this school year, the seventh graders will be working on writing their own procedural non-fiction essays. They will go through the process of choosing a topic, creating guiding questions, conducting research to gather information, drafting their essay, revising and editing, and completing a final draft.

8th Grade: In the third quarter of this school year, the eighth graders will be working on writing their own expository non-fiction essays. They will go through the process of choosing a topic, creating guiding questions, conducting research to gather information, drafting their essay, revising and editing, and completing a final draft.



Spanish Language Arts: Ms. Carissa <u>csotorod@jeffcoschools.us</u> \*This course is 100% in Spanish 6th Grade: Self-Awareness and Self-Care

We are working on our third unit of the year, Self-Awareness and Self-Care. In this unit. students learn about the different ways that young people develop and mature as they move from childhood to adolescence to adulthood, and how they can take care of themselves along this journey. By researching expert opinions from different cultures or regions and interviewing adults from their family or surroundings, students synthesize what they learn about human development to understand their own changing dynamics and needs.

#### 7th Grade: Creating Community

We are starting our fourth unit of the year that focuses on how people participate in various types of communities as an individual citizen and as a member of a group. Students will publish a newspaper/magazine about a community's news, issues, and events.

#### 8th Grade: Latino Leaders and Leadership

We are finishing up our unit on Latino Leaders and Leadership. During this unit students will be reading and writing about important leaders in the latino community and analyzing what makes a strong leader. The focus of this unit is informational texts.

#### **All Classes:**

Spelling: Students are continuing to work on including accents in their writing.

#### Grammar:

Students in 7th and 8th grade are studying how to conjugate verbs in the imperfect tense. We use the imperfect tense to talk about repeated or continuous actions in the past. The imperfect is used when the past action doesn't have a definite beginning and definite end.

Students in 6th grade, we are moving from present tense verb conjugations to past tense. We will be studying how to conjugate regular preterite tense verbs. We use the preterite tense to talk about completed actions at specific times in the past. The preterite is used when the past action has a definite beginning and definite end.

Please remember that all middle school students have grammar practice for homework twice a week.



#### Electives: Fitness, Health & Wellness; Choir & Vocals:

Drawing: Our 3rd quarter electives class is drawing. In drawing the middle school students will learn the basic of how to create a drawing using a variety of techniques. They will also learn how to use non traditional materials to create drawings.

Computer Science: Our Coding for Gaming Computer Science elective is underway. Students have explored and experienced the design process as they begin thinking about solving problems using coding. We are beginning to use code.org's Computer Science Discoveries program which allows students to explore and build coding/programming skills related to creating games.

#### Band I:

#### Orchestra I:

In Orchestra I we have been working on a unit where we focus on the basics of music theory which will help the students unlock a greater understanding of the functionality of music. We have been working hard preparing for our concert including our piece Caribbean Breeze. It features playing in multiple parts as well as new rhythms. The other piece we have been working on is called Abandoned Funhouse that features new notes and different styles of playing.

#### Orchestra II:

In Orchestra II we have been working on four pieces. The pieces we have been working on are To Catch a Pickpocket, Desert Sands, and Dark Visions. We are getting to the point in our music where we can focus on more than just the notes and rhythms. 

Hello Foster Families,

In January we will roll out a school-wide systemic practice for writing short constructed responses. Short constructed responses are a great way to check of understanding of concepts being taught. Short Constructed Responses (SCR) can be used in any content area and with the right support in any grade. We will use the following acronym and supports.

At home, you can begin by asking your student to put the question in the answer. That is essentially how we come up with a topic sentence. Try not to use the word because in the topic sentence.

Here is an example:

Parent: What is your favorite season? Student: My favorite season is summer.

Another example or time to practice topic sentences is as follows.

Parent: What was your favorite part about chapter 2?

Student: My favortie part was how the two characters became friends.

If you want to continue past topic sentences, please see some examples at the end of the document.

This SCR approach is researched based and will be used in addition to the HMH writing program we use in K-5 classrooms. Again, the big idea is that we are systemic with our approach to showing what we know through writing.

Sometimes, you might hear that the students are asked to do "caveman" writing, this is to jot down their ideas to formulate the short constructed response. This is supposed to be really simple and only a few words that would help the students know what they are going to write about in complete sentences.
