There has been so much growth and accomplishments from all our students. We are so proud of all the work they have done this year. It has been a pleasure working with your children and watching them grow academically, physically, and emotionally. Inquiry Study 7: Past, Present, Future: What is Different About Today, Part 2?

In this inquiry, we go back to discussing the past, present and future but focusing on our year together. What was different in our classroom in the past? How were you different in the past? What are some things we are doing now that we didn't do in the past. In the future, some students will be moving on to kindergarten while others will stay in preschool. We will repeat some activities, like a self-portrait, we did in the past and compare how different they are today. This is a fun unit to finish the school year.

Literacy

In Estrellita, we will finish the last few sounds (qu, z, h, y, x, k, w). We will continue to work on phonological awareness, Spanish syllables, and letter recognition. We encourage you to continue working with students this summer on some literacy activities such as reading and discussing books and the Estrellita sound chart. You can sign up for the Jeffco Public Library's Summer Reading Program where students can earn points for reading books with adults and earn fun prizes.

Math

As we wrap up the school year, we will focus on students recognizing numbers 1-10, shapes, colors, and subitizing. Students will continue working on solving number stories, understanding which numbers come before and after a given number, and comparing amounts as more or less. This summer, continue working with your child on counting, 1-1 matching when counting, number identification, and find any opportunity to give them a number story to solve using their fingers, counters, or any household item they can use to count with.

KINDERGARTEN NEWS



We have arrived at the last month of school! We have grown so much this year and continue learning, as we get ready for 1^{st} grade.

Our last Reading and Writing unit will be "Animal Habitats". In this module, children get up-close with black bears and bumblebees, with penguins and peccaries. They discover how each animal is uniquely suited to is environment- and see that animal's needs aren't so different from their own.

The first two weeks of reading will be spent with Ms. Alma in Spanish and writing in English with Miss Annika. Then we will switch and do writing in Spanish and Reading in English.

In Math, there will be a "Consolidation of Concepts." Students will be able to:

- Write numbers to 100
- Forward counting sequence to 100 by tens
- Explore numbers with relation to ten by breaking them apart into ten and some more or by finding how much to put with them to make ten.
- Recognize that teen numbers are made up of ten ones and some more ones.
- Recognize, solve, explain and create simple put together, add to, take apart or take from problems from real world context (within 10) using concrete materials, drawings, or mental images of quantities.
- Put several objects in order based on length, height, or weight.
- Use precise positioning to compare two objects to determine which is longer or shorter or if they are the same.

Our Geography Unit, "Different Places, Different Way to Live" will end with some fun hands on projects. We will also be taking some time to do many fun end of the year projects.

We thank you for all your support and for sharing your student with us.


In Into Reading / Arriba la Lectura we are working on Module 8. Reading will be in English. Students will build and strengthen their reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills as they explore storytelling.


Writing will be in Spanish for Module 8. Children will be learning how to write a personal narrative about someone who helped them overcome a problem.

In math, we will be working "Pulling the Learning Together" In this culminating unit, students have the opportunity to apply grade level content in problem solving situations. The essence of this unit is flexibility, in order to differentiate and address the needs of students.

In Science we are working on "A World of Boundaries", students will understand that maps and globes show both natural and man-made boundaries. Students also understand that people interact across boundaries (natural and man-made) for various reasons.

Keep an eye out for more fun end of the year activities! We have thoroughly enjoyed being your students' teachers!





Dear Families,

We are in the fourth quarter and it's the one that matters most! Soon we will be taking the final MAP Assessment and we're hoping to see a grand finale for 2023. Let's finish strong! The theme for **Reading** and **Writing** is, <u>Time to Grow</u>. In reading students are learning vocabulary associated with seeds and planting. In Writing, students are writing a procedural text of their choice (How to...). They are using linked words such as, primero, luego, después, entonces, enseguida, finalmente, etc. We are also learning about accents (tilde) in Spanish and when it is used as well as verb tenses.

In **Math** we have started learning about arrays which prepares students for multiplication, division and fractions. We are also doing a review of everything that has been covered year round, (boot camp for MAP testing). Students have been working hard with adding and subtracting 3-digit numbers. We are getting it! Students are becoming more confident at regrouping and ungrouping numbers. This is complex thinking that requires students to have a deep understanding of our number system. Remember as you help your children at home that students use multiple strategies for showing their thinking and understanding of hundreds, tens and ones when solving problems.

Our final unit in **Social Studies** is, *Geography: People Interacting with the Environment*. This unit teaches map skills and knowledge of their place in the world. They are learning about the different continents and have chosen a country to research and are making a book in Bookcreator.

Please remind your children to stay FOCUSED ON LEARNING these last few weeks of school. We plan on MAP testing in a couple of weeks and need to keep up the good work. We'll let you know exact dates so you can plan on student attendance during that week. We thank you for your support as we continue to grow and learn. Thank you for all of the support this year! You have been so giving and willing to help or send items needed. We could not do this without you!

News from Ms. Elena: I want to add a personal note that this will be my last year at Foster. After much consideration, I made a decision to retire in June. It has been a great year to end with (finally a normal one). It has been a great pleasure working with the Foster community. The parent involvement and support here is impressive! Dear Third Grade Families,

We can't believe we are writing our last newsletter of the school year. It has been an incredible school year with so much growth and so much learning. It has been a pleasure working with each and every one of our students this school year. We have had some challenges with both of us learning a new literacy program, so we appreciate your patience and understanding as we learned how to implement the curriculum. We are so touched by all the families that have donated snacks for our students, their time for our field trips, and their energy for helping with our Friday Folders. We want to give a special shout out to Cindy and Emily who have consistently helped us with our Friday Folders. We don't know if you two will ever really understand how much of a help that was for us. We appreciate you both so much for that!! We also want to thank all of our students' families for all their support in their child's learning. From practicing spelling words, ensuring that your child reads daily, getting them on IXL for math practice, coming to conferences and all the wonderful things you did to help support their learning! We could not have done this without you. We hope you have an amazing summer break. We encourage you to continue to be your child's teacher during this break. Motivate your child to read daily, work on their multiplication tables, write about their days, play in nature, and most importantly discover new things!

Here is what we are learning in class with Ms. Paola:

Reading: Over the next three weeks in Module 9, our class will develop knowledge about the origin of food, with a focus on the genre of informational text. We will read texts and watch videos about how food gets to our tables.

Social Studies: Students understand that various people, events, and ideas cause change over time in different regions of the Western United States. They will also understand the role of citizens by participating in civic actions and responsibilities inside and outside of their classrooms. They will also understand how community members depend on each other through the exchange of goods and services.

SLD: In order to support our HMH unit for module 8 students will focus on their Spanish fluency and phonemic awareness. They will also review and practice the vocabulary from Arriba la lectura. The students are also focusing on the right pronunciation of Spanish words and phrases.



Here is what we are learning in class with Ms. Mari:

Writing: Our last module of the school year, Module 9: From Farm to Table, will focus on the essential question, How does food get to your table? In writing, students will write different types of poems about various topics. We will read lots of poetry for inspiration and discuss the attributes of poems. We will utilize the writing process: prewriting, drafting, revising, editing and publishing to write poems. Some of the foundational skills we will focus on in this module are decoding spelling words with suffixes, words with the spelling pattern *-ough* and *-augh*, and words with the /j/ and /s/ sound but that have a different spelling pattern. For grammar we will focus on proper abbreviations, contraction words, and proper use of commas.

Math: We have completed all our units for math, therefore, we will use these last few weeks to really hone in on important math skills such as fluently adding and subtracting, fluently multiplying and dividing, reviewing fractions, and geometry, specifically area and perimeter.

ELD:

In English Language Development (ELD), we are building our listening, speaking and comprehension skills in English. We are using this time to reteach and deepen their knowledge of the module's vocabulary, generative vocabulary (prefixes and suffixes), grammar, and foundational skills.

Reminders:

- Daily reading is an important habit in 3rd grade. Please be sure to read every night, in both languages, with your child.
- Continue to practice math skills at home using IXL. Login information was sent home. Please let us know if you need it again.
- Library checkouts are now on Wednesday and Thursdays so please return books by the previous Tuesday.
- Please bring a healthy snack for your child or donate a healthy snack for 42 students.
 Students MUST come to school with their chromebooks fully charged each day. We have had several students come to school with Chromebooks not charged.

Hello Foster families! I have greatly enjoyed my second year at Foster! Here is what to expect from music classes as we wrap up the school year:

For kindergarten students, music classes will continue playing, singing, and moving to a steady beat. First grade students will complete their studies of rhythm vs. beat by playing and singing songs with multiple parts. In both classes, we will enjoy songs about spring, flowers, insects, and summer vacation activities!

Students in 2nd grade are now masters of singing solfege syllables and playing Boomwhackers! We will complete the year with transitioning this knowledge to Orff instruments, playing and singing simultaneously.

As we draw close to the end of the school year, you may be wondering what you will be doing with school devices over the summer. Here's the district plan:

Kindergarten students returning to Foster in the fall may keep their school iPad. In the fall, we will collect iPads, chargers and covers and students will be issued a district-owned Chromebook for their use moving forward. If you are not returning to Foster in the fall, please return iPads and components at the end of the school year. These devices are the property of Foster.

First through eighth grade students will keep their district Chromebooks if they are either returning to Foster or another Jeffco school. If they are not returning to a Jeffco school or transferring to any charter school, their device and charger will be turned in at the end of the school year. Eighth grade students will exchange their current device for a new device at their new Jeffco high school in the fall.

When returning a device, missing components (chargers, covers) will be charged to student accounts for replacement. It is important to return the exact components issued with the device. If plans change over the summer and a student will not be returning to a Jeffco school, please make a plan to return the school or district device when school reopens or to Jeffco's IT at 809 Quail. End of Year Library Notes:

Students will continue to check out Foster library books until May 5. All library books are due May 12. If you are receiving overdue notices for books that may have been returned, please check with library staff. We will recheck the shelves for the missing titles. Students will also be encouraged to check in their classroom. If the book is not found, the student is asked to pay for the

missing title. Any unpaid costs for missing books at the close of the school year will be placed on Campus accounts for payment. If families are unable to pay for missing books, please just let library staff know.


Summer is so close we can almost taste it! There are just 20 more days of school left!
