Thank you to you for all you are doing to help your child be successful through remote learning.


Please note the following

- Students are expected to complete work and submit the work to the teacher each day. (Tuesday-Friday each week we are out of school)
- Make sure that your child checks in with the classroom teacher each day. (Tuesday-Friday each week we are out of school) This is how we are taking attendance.
- If your child has not been able to connect with the internet, please communicate with us so that we can direct you to get help. We will be out of school for several weeks and it is very important that your child participate in the instruction. Over 90% of the students at Foster are connecting with their teacher daily at this point.
- Next week is spring break, which gives you some time to get internet/connectivity set up.

We will not have instruction next week but will start up again March 31<sup>st</sup>.

Thank you for helping your child to continue learning. This is a new experience for all of us and we need to work together to be sure our students continue learning. We will make it through this and will be even better for the lessons we learned.

Spring has arrived! We only have a couple months left of school, yet there is still much to be done!

We have turned our focus toward nonfiction and kindergarteners love it. Students are also learning to use various graphic organizers to help them with story structure. We are creating stories in math as well. Practice creating and solving simple addition and subtraction stories at home to build language. Use simple household objects like food and toys to act out the stories.

Make learning sight words fun by building the words with clay or rocks or using sidewalk chalk. Nightly reading practice can include alphabet practice, sight word practice, reading books - paper ones or digital (Epic), as well as being read to.

Our year end literacy assessments will be given at the very beginning of May. Thus, it's really important that every kindergartner continues to work on strengthening these critical literacy skills during Spring Break and the month of April. We are all a team in the education of your child so thanks again for your support!


We are very excited to have started our PBL this year around the external animal features!.

Dear 2nd grade families,

Though March is a short month, we have packed it FULL of learning. In math, second graders became fluent in reading and creating graphs. Students also worked on being able to tell time to the nearest 5 minutes for analog and digital clocks. Our next math unit will begin adding and subtracting with 3-digit numbers. Please practice with your students at home!

On March 12th, we celebrated the ending of our weather unit by showcasing our learning with music, art, dancing, and academics. Special thanks to our amazing AMP team for supporting our learning! After Spring break we will begin our new social studies unit where we study how communities change over time. This unit will hopefully include a field trip to Four Mile House. NOTE: We will have one last round of testing at the end of the year in May when we take MAPS (English reading, English math, Spanish reading). Dates to be determined.

In math, we are exploring algebra and measurement/data. Please continue to help your students practice their multiplication (and division) facts daily. This can be done with flashcards, on blank paper or using an iPad. They should be able to do math facts up to 12 quickly.

In reading and writing, we have just finished a wonderful chapter book titled "Esperanza Rising" and our last couple of units are review of fiction and nonfiction and key comprehension strategies.





We are now in our third trimester of the year and students will be working with new concepts using the Jefferson County Schools guaranteed and viable curriculum for music. Kinder: participating in music activities, pitched/non-pitched instruments, solfege, vocal techniques, movement.

1<sup>st</sup> grade: AB form, solfege, conducting cues, explore and express musical ideas, louder/softer, listen/respond, pitched/nonpitched, quarter/eighth notes, performance skills, strong/weak beat, ensembles, vocal qualities, instrumental techniques.

<u>2<sup>nd</sup> grade</u>: 2 part canons, bar lines/measures, crescendo/decrescendo, meter, explore/ express musical ideas, fermata, dynamics, tempo, listen/respond, performance skills, ensembles, vocal/instrumental techniques.

3<sup>rd</sup> grade:1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> endings, fine, 2 chord accompaniments, solfege, explore/express musical ideas, listen/respond, dynamics, recorders, performance skills, time signatures, ensembles, vocal/instrumental techniques.

4<sup>th</sup> grade: 3 chord accompaniments, time signatures, solfege, tempo markings, beat/contrasting rhythm, explore/express musical ideas, listen/respond, ensembles, partner songs, performance skills, theme and variations, time signature, vocal/instrumental techniques.

5<sup>th</sup> grade: 12 bar blues, sixteenth/eighths, compositions, countermelodies, diminuendo, conductor cues, I,IV,V7 chords, improvisation, key signatures, sight reading, track score, ensembles, vocal/instrumental techniques.

Jeffco now provides families with the ability to monitor and control their student's internet and app activity on district devices at home using the free SecurlyHome app. Securly manages the filtering for school-issued devices when they are away from school. The SecurlyHome app offers parents the ability to both

monitor and control students' internet activity outside of the Jeffco Public Schools network. Once you create a parent account, you will

have a real-time view of your child's activity on their school device. Additional information can be found on Jeffco's website linked here: <u>SecurlyHome App</u>

If you are interested in purchasing an extended warranty for the school assigned Chromebook your child is using (5th through 7th grade), please review the information linked below. The warranty provides coverage for accidental damage to devices that are otherwise the responsibility of families. The cost of an extended warranty is less than the cost of repairing one cracked screen! This must be purchased before the end of the school year.


After launching the district-wide TechForEd program this fall, the district is now providing families with the ability to monitor and control their student's internet and app activity on district devices at home using the free **SecurlyHome app**.

While Jeffco Public Schools uses a Palo Alto firewall to monitor and filter activity and content for students when they are in school, Securly manages the filtering for school-issued devices when they are away from school.

The **SecurlyHome** app offers parents the ability to both monitor and control students' internet activity outside of the Jeffco Public Schools network. The ability to monitor activity will be released the week of March 16 and the ability to control (turn off and on) categories of applications will be released a few weeks later in early April.

If your student's device is eligible for this program, during the week of March 16 you will receive a welcome email asking you to download the **SecurlyHome app** and create an account.

Once you create a parent account, you will have a real-time view of your child's activity on their school device. You will also get a weekly email from Securly with a snapshot report of that activity and will be able to check your student's internet activity anytime during the day.

Keep in mind that no web filter is perfect and there is the risk of inappropriate content making its way through the filter. Securly does catch and filter a majority of traffic categorized as pornography, drugs, and gambling. However, active monitoring while communicating your expectations and boundaries clearly with your children is the best way to keep them safe online. Our hope is that the SecurlyHome app will help you in this process.

As a reminder, *District Policy JS – Student Use of District Computing Resources and the Internet* states that there should be no expectation of privacy when using district-issued devices. You should also remember that Securly is not only active when students are connected to home networks, but also when connected to hotspots and public networks such as those offered at Starbucks, McDonalds, etc.
